Special tax-free IRA gifts: For those ages 70½ or older, a total of up to \$100,000 a year can be transferred directly from traditional or Roth IRAs to qualified charities such as your parish, a Catholic School, Catholic Charities or your favorite Catholic cause free from federal income tax. Amounts given in this way count toward required IRA minimum withdrawal amounts for the year of the gift. Many Catholics are taking advantage of this provision for their charitable giving. Need Help Paying For Your Medication?

Prescription drug assistance programs may help. This is a free service to help you get the long-term medicines you need (drugs you take regularly). We can help you find out if you meet drug company program guidelines and help you fill out the forms needed to get help paying for your medicine. **Who can apply:** People who live in Mahoning, Trumbull, Columbiana and Ashtabula counties; Are age 18 or older; Do not have prescription drug coverage or are under-insured. (Can also assist some Medicare Part D participants.); Have a doctor who is willing to help; Meets income guidelines.
