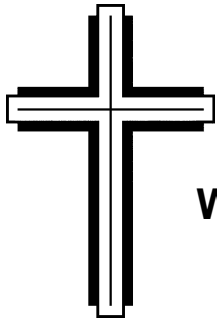

**Stewardship Thought:** In today's New Testament reading, Saint Paul urges us to offer our "bodies as a living sacrifice." While not necessarily calling us to give up our physical bodies, he is calling us to share the gift of our lives in a way that is pleasing to God.
