Kolbe Gathering: The Diocese of Youngstown, through its Prison Ministry program has started **The Kolbe Gathering**. Kolbe Gathering is a place for the formerly incarcerated and their families to join with parish-based volunteers in spiritual support and fellowship. Our gatherings embrace spirituality in prayer, music, scripture reading and fellowship, all in a welcoming and warm environment. It is through our actions that we can share God’s unconditional love and support to each other. Kolbe Gathering can help those who are in need and looking for a parish or faith-based organizations to join. Our initial gatherings take place on the first and third Thursday of the month from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m. at Holy Apostle SS Peter and Paul Church, 421 Covington Street in Youngstown. During the pandemic, we will adhere to social distancing and masks as needed. The Kolbe Gathering takes its name from the Saint Maximilian Kolbe, the Patron Saint for prisoners and drug addicts. Scholarship & Placement Exam: Ursuline High School will administer its scholarship and placement test on Saturday, **February 26, 2022** from 8:15 until 11:00 a.m. in the Ursuline Cafeteria. All students enrolled in a Catholic School have taken the placement test at their respective elementary school. Schools will forward the results to Ursuline High School. There is no charge for the test. Students should bring two #2 pencils, a calculator and a bottle of water. Students will arrive at the 10 North Door (main entrance on Bryson Street) and then report to the main office. To register for the test, go to www.Ursuline.com/rsvp. Placement in honors courses is based upon successful completion of this exam. The awarding of certain academic scholarships is based on this test as well.

Special tax-free IRA gifts: For those ages 70½ or older, a total of up to \$100,000 a year can be transferred directly from traditional or Roth IRAs to qualified charities such as your parish, a Catholic School, Catholic Charities or your favorite Catholic cause free from federal income tax. Amounts given in this way count toward required IRA minimum withdrawal amounts for the year of the gift. Many Catholics are taking advantage of this provision for their charitable giving.
