CANCELLATION - Ecumenical Evening Prayer: For scheduling and logistical reasons, the Lutheran-Catholic Covenant Evening Prayer scheduled for this Sunday, **October 24, 2021** has been **postponed**. About Our Lutheran-Catholic Covenant: Following the 1999 *Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification* agreed to by the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and the Lutheran World Federation, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Youngstown and the Northeastern Ohio Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America entered into Covenant on October 29, 2000 in Saint Columba Cathedral. Signed by Bishop Thomas J. Tobin, Diocese of Youngstown, and Bishop Marcus J. Miller, NEO Synod, in Saint Columba Cathedral, the Covenant professes a common Confession of Faith and dedicates the Diocese and Synod to pray, study, and act for Christian unity.
