This online training provides information about the signs and symptoms of abuse and what steps you can take to prevent and/or report. Please take time this month to pray *A Prayer for Healing Victims of Abuse*, which is provided by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. *God of endless love, ever caring, ever strong, always present, always just. You gave your only Son to save us by his blood on the cross. Gentle Jesus, shepherd of peace, join to your own suffering the pain of all who have been hurt in body, mind, and spirit by those who betrayed the trust placed in them. Hear the cries of our brothers and sisters who have been gravely harmed, and the cries of those who love them. Grant them justice for their cause, enlightened by your truth. Holy Spirit, comforter of hearts, heal your people's wounds and transform brokenness into wholeness. Grant us the courage and wisdom, humility and grace, to act with justice.
