Special tax-free IRA Gifts: for those ages 70 ½ or older, a total of up to \$100,000 a year can be transferred directly from traditional or Roth IRA's to qualified charities such as your parish, a Catholic School, Catholic Charities or your favorite Catholic cause free from federal income tax. Amounts given in this way count toward required IRA minimum withdrawal amounts for the year of the gift. Many Catholics are taking advantage of this provision for their charitable giving. Day of Prayer: The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no 373, designates **January 22, 2024** as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the “Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children”: “In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 24 (or January 23, when the 22nd falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through act of abortion.” Additional information and resources may be found at www.respectlife.org/january-22.
