**First Step for Change:** Beginning this weekend, our parish will be participating in *First Step for Change*, a project sponsored by Catholic Charities to collect money in order to assist low-income pregnant women and families with food, formula, clothing, diapers and other items essential to a child's health, safety and well-being. 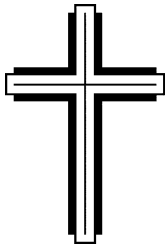
