

### Pastor's Column

The Twenty-Ninth Sunday In Ordinary Time
As We Journey Together, May Christ Light Our Way.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

St. Paul encourages us today "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching." The Scriptures today show us the power of the Lord and the creative power of persistence, patience and trust. The invitation and challenge that I offer to you and me is to search for and recognize where the Love of Jesus has touched our life or the lives of those around us. If we struggle to find these signs of the Lord's love, then look at the lives of the Saints. Consider looking at the lives of our patrons. Among our patrons are St. Columba, St. Angela, St. Edward, St. Patrick and SS. Peter and Paul among others. We cannot give witness to the love and mercy of Jesus until we recognize it in our own lives.



As we face the changes our neighboring parishes are encountering, let's commit ourselves in

prayer for each other, let us renew a spirit of welcome and hospitality. Everyone needs a Church home. Help make them at home here.

As we change Mass schedules, we will need to modify how we schedule Mass intentions. This is a very good and valuable devotion, offering Mass intentions for our deceased loved ones or for a special intention for the living. I will be sharing with you more information on how Mass intentions reflect love and prayer. They can also be an essential support for priests in the Missions.

Just a reminder, if you are visiting Mass elsewhere, your envelopes will be sent to St. Columba.

#### Reflection

# Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Perseverance

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives a clever example of why we are to persevere in praying, even if we think the prayer is not being heard. The crooked judge just wanted to get that widow off his back. So we can pray to God with even more confidence, because we know that God loves us and will answer our prayers.

St. Paul carries that theme of perseverance even further. He is not just talking about prayer here; he encourages Timothy to persevere in proclaiming God's word as well. That command we may find more challenging than prayer. He tells Timothy (and us!) to "convince, reprimand and encourage through all patience and teaching" (2 Timothy 4:2). How can we do that?

"Convince" reminds me that our faith should be reasonable. Jesus' command to love one another, for instance, can be taught much more convincingly by giving examples of love. A mother who hugs her child when he is hurt and encourages him when he feels lost is teaching that command in a way that will be remembered much longer than just telling him to love people.

Paul also talks about reprimanding each other. Most people find it difficult to reprimand someone they are in charge of, much less one who is equal in status. That's where patience comes in. A reprimand can be made patiently and gently, as a sign of concern rather than authority.

Paul lastly mentions teaching. Parents can do their part by teaching the stories from the Bible, helping children to see God in creation, teaching them to pray, and being good examples of God's love for them. If you send your children to religion classes or the parish school, do what you can to support the teachers so that what the children learn at school is practiced at home. -Tom Schmidt

#### Reconciliation

#### **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**

A person who desires to become a Catholic is encouraged to be a part of a religious process which may begin each autumn and may culminate with the Sacraments of Initiation being celebrated at the Easter Vigil.

#### Marriage

Please make arrangements with Monsignor Siffrin at least six months before the marriage is to be celebrated. All engaged couples participate in a preparation program for their marriage following the diocesan and our parish's guidelines.

## Saint of The Week

# SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES (1560-1646) AND JOHN DE BRÉBEUF (1593-1649) AND THEIR COMPANIONS October 19

Their mission was to New France, but these missionaries found in present day New York State and the Province of Ontario a world wildly different from the homes they left behind. Six Jesuit priests, Fathers Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier,



and Noel Chabanel—and Jesuit lay volunteers Rene Goupil and John Lalande—shared the gospel with the Native Americans they met, in languages they painstakingly learned, and through images they creatively adapted to the indigenous cultures (for example, John de Brebeuf's "'Twas in the Moon of Wintertime: the Huron Carol"). But their evangelization was caught up in turmoil beyond their control: a smallpox epidemic, battles between French and English trading interests—the traders united only by their willingness to exploit the Native Americans—and conflict among the tribes themselves, Huron, Mohawk, Iroquois. The missionaries' perseverance despite exhausting hardships, their steadfast courage in facing unspeakable tortures, and undaunted love even for those who martyred them, bore fruit, immediately in Kateri Tekakwitha's sanctity, eventually in the Catholicism that still flourishes in the United States and Canada.
