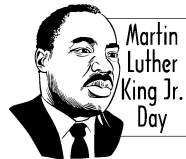

Special tax-free IRA gifts: For those ages 70½ or older, a total of up to \$100,000 a year can be transferred directly from traditional or Roth IRAs to qualified charities such as your parish, a Catholic School, Catholic Charities or your favorite Catholic cause free from federal income tax. Amounts given in this way count toward required IRA minimum withdrawal amounts for the year of the gift. Many Catholics are taking advantage of this provision for their charitable giving. Need Help Paying For Your Medication? Prescription drug assistance programs may help. This is a free service to help you get the long-term medicines you need (drugs you take regularly). We can help you find out if you meet drug company program guidelines and help you fill out the forms needed to get help paying for your medicine. **Who can apply:** People who live in Mahoning, Trumbull, Columbiana and Ashtabula counties; Are age 18 or older; Do not have prescription drug coverage or are under-insured. Masses for Life: Each year in January we recall the infamous Supreme Court decisions *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton* that effectively legalized abortion on demand throughout the United States. Our diocese hosts two Masses for Life as a prayerful reminder that we “must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence.” Masses for Life, will be held on Tuesday, **January 18** at 6:30 p.m. in the Our Lady of Perpetual Help Chapel at Walsh University, North Canton, 2020 E Maple Street and Sunday, **January 23, 2022** at 4:00 p.m. at Saint Columba Cathedral. Each Mass for Life will include a Blessing of Children in the Womb and will be followed by a reception. All are welcome – no reservations needed. The National Prayer Vigil for Life will take place from Thursday, **January 20** through Friday, **January 21, 2022** at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. **The Vigil program has once again been adjusted due to ongoing concerns about the pandemic.** The January 20 Opening Mass will begin at 5:30 p.m. and will be immediately followed by a 7:00 – 8:00 p.m. Holy Hour for Life, concluding the evening portion of the Vigil program. Both the Mass and Holy Hour will be televised live by EWTN so that millions can participate remotely. The following morning, the Closing Mass on January 21 will take place once again at the Basilica at 8:00 a.m. and will also be televised by EWTN. Rather than the Basilica being open to the normal crowd of 12,000+ pilgrims for the January 20-21 Vigil events, there will instead be a 3,000-person limit, arranged through an electronic reservation system through the Basilica’s website.

The March for Life in Washington D.C. is expected to proceed as scheduled on Friday, **January 21, 2022**, and this year’s theme is “Equality Begins in the Womb.” HOWEVER, the Diocese of Youngstown’s Department of Pastoral & Educational Services’ *Guidelines for Programming During COVID-19* stipulate that “With the understanding that the majority of children and teens have not been vaccinated, overnight trips continue to be strongly discouraged.
