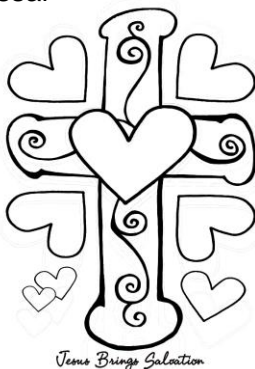

Placement and Scholarship Test: Ursuline High School will administer its placement and scholarship test on Thursday, February 25, 2021 from 3:30 until 6:30 p.m. All students enrolled in a Catholic school have taken the placement test at their respective elementary school. Schools will forward the results to Ursuline High School. There is no charge for the test. Students should bring two #2 pencils, a calculator and a bottle of water. Students will arrive at the 10 North Door (main entrance on Bryson Street) and then report to the main office. To register for the test, call the school office at 330-744-4563. Placement in honors courses is based upon successful completion of this exam. The awarding of certain academic scholarships is based on this test as well.

Those wishing to donate an Easter plant in memory of a deceased member of your family or other, may do so by making a \$15.00 donation per plant. Please fill out the information on the back of the envelope and place it in the collection basket or mail it to the rectory. The names will be listed in the bulletin the weekend after Easter Sunday. These flowers will be used to decorate the Cathedral.

Guidelines for Mass

Thank you for wearing your mask while in the Cathedral

- Holy water fonts are to remain empty until further notice.
- All hymnals/missalettes are to be removed and stored for the time being. Disposable worship aids will be distributed and then discarded.
- The practice of passing baskets throughout the assembly for offering collection is temporarily suspended. Baskets will be placed throughout the Cathedral for you to place your envelope.
- Physical contact during the Lord's Prayer (holding hands) and the Sign of Peace is suspended. For the Sign of Peace, you are encouraged to bow to others and offer words of peace.
- For receiving Holy Communion, it is highly encouraged and strongly recommended that the reception of Holy Communion be given in the hand. While reception of Holy Communion on the tongue cannot be prohibited, it is discouraged at this time. Those desiring to receive Holy Communion on the tongue are to be last in line and receive only from the priest. In the event that the priest's fingers come in contact with the mouth and/or saliva of the communicant, he will immediately sanitize his fingers before continuing with the next in line. The priest will direct you by section when you are to begin receiving Holy Communion. Markings are placed on the floor to keep a social distance when approaching.
- Reception of the Precious Blood from the chalice by the assembly is temporarily suspended.
- When approaching the minister, if wearing a mask, the communicant is to pull their mask below their chin.
