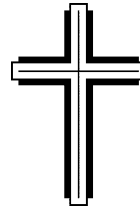

Stewardship Thought: “And Peter said to them, ‘Repent, and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ...’” Acts 2:38

The word “repent” means to turn from sin – to change our thoughts, words and actions. Change that is permanent comes from within – a transformation or conversion of heart. This requires prayer, discipline and perseverance. Change is hard. The first step is recognizing that we are broken and that we need God’s help. The good news – we are not alone in our journey. Ask Jesus daily for guidance and patiently listen for his response.

Child Abuse Prevention Month: April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. It serves as an annual reminder of the importance of families and communities working together to prevent child abuse and neglect. The Catholic Church remains dedicated to being at the forefront of raising awareness about the scourge of child abuse, implementing the best policies and procedures to protect children from potential abusers, and working with professionals to bring healing to those who have been abused. During the month of April, you are encouraged to visit the diocesan safe environment webpage at www.doy.org/safe-environment/, where you will find reporting resources and access to our free online safe environment VIRTUS training. This online training provides information about the signs and symptoms of abuse and what steps you can take to prevent and/or report. Please take time this month to pray *A Prayer for Healing Victims of Abuse*, which is provided by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. *God of endless love, ever caring, ever strong, always present, always just. You gave you only Son to save us by his blood on the cross. Gentle Jesus, shepherd of peace, join to your own suffering the pain of all who have been hurt in body, mind, and spirit by those who betrayed the trust placed in them. Hear the cries of our brothers and sisters who have been gravely harmed, and the cries of those who love them. Grant them justice for their cause, enlightened by your truth. Holy Spirit, comforter of hearts, heal your people’s wounds and transform brokenness into wholeness. Grant us the courage and wisdom, humility and grace, to act with justice. Breathe wisdom into our prayers and labors. Grant that all harmed by abuse may find peace in justice. We ask this through Christ, our Lord Amen.*

Religious Brothers Day: Religious Brothers Day is **May 1, 2023**, the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Two years after Pope Francis declared 2015 the Year for Consecrated Life, Brothers Think Tank, an informal organization composed of individuals involved in ministry with brothers, encouraged school communities and ministry sites across the United States to celebrate the life and vocation of the religious brother through prayer services, special events, liturgies, and vocation events. Since May 1, 2017, this annual observation focuses on four categories: pray, thank, celebrate, and share. Annual Diocesan Appeal: Today, we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter, more commonly called “Good Shepherd Sunday”. Each year, we hear a different Gospel centered on the role of the Shepherd. Yet we know that there are many who want – not lavish things, but the basic necessities of life. The challenge is for many of us to recognize the wants that have been fulfilled in our lives and extend Christ’s love to others by sharing those blessings with them.
